- This is chassis #36. Car was delivered January 12, 1953. Delivered new in Morocco.
- #36 raced in the 1953 Dakar GP, achieving 1st place . Placed 4th in Marrakesh GP. Car was crashed in Portuguese GP.
- 036 were rebuilt in UK, using many D type parts and then spent many years in France. Car was purchased by present owner in 1998.
- A total of 53 C-Types were built, 43 of which were sold to private owners, mainly in the US.
- The Jaguar C-Type (also called the Jaguar XK120-C) is a racing sports car built by Jaguar and sold from 1951 to 1953. The "C" stands for "competition". The car used the XK 120 running gear of the contemporary road proven XK120 in a lightweight tubular frame designed by William Heynes and an aerodynamic aluminium body jointly developed by Heynes, R J (Bob) Knight and later Malcolm Sayer.
